

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
Introduction

Costa Rica

Costa Rica extends majestically from the Pacific Ocean to the Caribbean Sea, and its distance is barely 200 miles. Its land portion occupies only 20 thousand square miles.

If you travel throughout the provinces of Costa Rica, it's easy to notice that in no other place you shall find fields with so many variations in their landscape and climate as here.

Costa Rica is one of most highly valued tourist destinations in this planet. This small piece of land includes all of the necessary components to satisfy the taste of thousands of travelers visiting each year.

The fact that more than two million tourists visit Costa Rica each year does not happen by

chance. Costa Rica, located in Central America, is an isthmus where life seems to have created its roots. Covering only 0.03% of the surface of our planet, Costa Rica has approximately 6% of the world's biodiversity.

Our Project is located in the Guanacaste area of Costa Rica, surrounded by the **MIRAVALLES NATIONAL PARK**

The park's main attraction is its volcano, the tallest one (2,028 meters above sea level) in Guanacaste's Cordillera Volcánica, Bagaces canton. Its slopes feature hot springs. Volcanic fumaroles can also be visited. There are beautiful waterfalls in the area, such as Cabro Muco and the waterfall on the grounds of the college in La Fortuna, near to which are several lakes. In addition, this area is home to Costa Rica's largest geothermal electricity production project.

There are significant number of attractions, parks and beaches near Ailanto thus lending our project maximum exposure and desirability.



Ailanto Land Development

We have acquired approximately 33 Hectares of land in the Guanacaste area, 45 minutes (by car) from Liberia Airport, Costa Rica's most significant International Airport and right in the midst of all the major tourist attractions, beaches and beautiful ecological forests of Costa Rica.

Ailanto Mountain Reserve

From the 33 hectares of unspoiled beauty, 4 hectares are dedicated to Paraiso's 50 Homes, Pools, Gazebos, Medical and Dental Centers. The Spa, gymnasium, and other amenities are shared with the remainder of the development which include Vacation Bungalows, Thermal Waters, Hiking trails, Jungle Gyms, Mud Pools, Restaurant and Event Center.

The housing development uses these amenities as a benefit of home ownership and residence at Paraiso.

In our current Master Plan, we have an addition to Paraiso's 50 homes, 50 Quintas of 5,000 square meters or more, 9 lots of 1,000 square meters (many already sold), an Indian Village which is used as the Natural Spa. These Quintas and are available at low prices with the intention of creating a LOW DENSITY GREEN ENVIRONMENT with restrictions as to the amount of construction that could take place.

A great feature of our Homes is that each of them splits into 2 to 4 suites (depending on the model) and as such, a Homeowner could enjoy low prices, yet the privacy which is desired.

Development Plan

Part of the land is zoned as Agricultural, using this law, we have subdivided these into Quintas (Large 5000 Square Meters Parcels) and subdivided the land fronting the public road into 1,000 meter lots, giving us medium density in the front and low density everywhere else. These are large lots with much common area and an open feeling.

Our plan calls for the development of homes that vary from 40 to 450 meters each.

A Homeowners Association maintains the standards of the community.

We expect to complete the construction by the winter of 2015.

The Paraiso Residences at Ailanto

50 Residences ranging in size from 40 to 75 Square Meters. Each home is well appointed for living comfort, the homes are open and spacious, perfect for Retirees' downsizing for their Golden Years, since all the green space (over 20 hectares) is open, everyone can enjoy a true green and ample paradise for the price of a small home

This construction phase is being handled through Toque Del Cielo SA, a Costa Rican Sociedad Anonima ("TDC") and it's Contractors. It is expected that much of the work will be subcontracted to Costa Rican construction companies.

TDC has extensive experience in developing and building entry level to Luxury Custom Homes.

We are pioneering Rustic Luxury, where we strive to maintain the Ecological Environment in lieu of building large cement complexes or homes that do not meld into our pristine location. No one can offer what we can at the prices that we offer with our full complement of amenities.

The lots are large ranging from 1,000 meters to 7,800 meters and what is more we don't expect to build in more than 30% of the entire property, that means ample open areas and beautiful settings for each and every home.

We respect our ecological gift so you won't see any non-native plants. We possess a Rain Forest and all the creatures that thrive within it. Although rarely seen but often heard, Monkeys, Toucan or Pavas and many other species that they call Ailanto home. Enjoy the rhythms of the forest as it sings and welcomes you.

Enjoy the private retreat at Ailanto, all the residences are luxurious; there is not one better than the other just some are larger than others.

They are all comfortable well-appointed accommodations with Queen, or two double beds plus a patio/deck. Each is equipped with a kitchenette and large showers. We have already constructed 7 homes

The Master plan is completed; we have received the Setena Approval, all the plans only need to be presented to the Municipality for construction permits

The Market

Rising healthcare costs in the United States and Canada have been the greatest boost to international health tourism, but it is by no means the only factor driving this new industry. The main engine driving the new wellness revolution is the baby boomers, the population born between 1945 and 1964. One billion baby boomers turn 60 this year and are looking for effective strategies to stay healthy, young looking, and more active. This population represents only 16% of the world population but controls 65% of its wealth and resources. Savvy baby boomers will consider the higher quality and wider spectrum of health care services offered in Costa Rica and other Latin America destinations.

Some important trends guarantee that the market for medical tourism will continue to expand in the years ahead. By 2015, the health of the vast Baby Boom generation will have begun its slow, final decline, and, with more than 220 million Boomers in the United States, Canada, Europe, Australia and New Zealand, this represents a significant market for high-quality medical care.

At a staggering \$1.8 trillion dollars annually, the American healthcare system is the world's largest and least effective bureaucracy. The triad of insurance companies and state and Federal regulatory agencies in Canada and the U.S. has limited consumer choices and access to care. Competition in the healthcare sector is at an all time low. Health consumers seeking alternative approaches to the treatment of cancer, stroke, and heart disease have found services south of the border more accessible, patient oriented, more effective and less costly.

A primary goal of Ailanto is to address the physical, emotional and spiritual needs of international visitors. To establish balance and health, guests are encouraged to spend time extended period of time at the facilities. Some may visit for only a few days while others may choose to extend their healing holidays to several weeks. When they are not busy undergoing treatments at the centers they can join friends and family members to partake of the many social, cultural and sport

activities available at the resort. Activities at our health community or nearby include nature walks, biking, swimming, fishing, horseback riding, hiking, cooking, painting, gardening, bird watching and sightseeing.

Access

Costa Rica is easily accessible by air from all parts of the world. It has an open health care system, well-equipped modern clinics and hospitals, and medical personnel trained in the finest international teaching centers.

Costa Rica is not only visited for its ecological wonders but also for the medical services it offers, Costa Rica offers the services of very competent plastic surgeons and dentists, two of the specialties that are in high demand. The quality of these professionals is unquestionable as is shown by the health indices given by the World Health Organization. At Ailanto you can access these professionals and recover in our Eco Country Environment.

Conventional Tourism

At 50,895 square kilometers, Costa Rica is the second-smallest Central American nation after El Salvador. At its narrowest point, in the south, only 119 km separate the Caribbean from the Pacific. Even in the north one can savor a leisurely breakfast on the Caribbean and take an ambling five-hour drive to the Pacific for dinner. At its broadest point, Costa Rica is a mere 280 km wide. On the ruler-straight eastern seaboard, barely 160 km separate the Nicaraguan and Panamanian borders. And while the Pacific coast is longer, it is still only 480 km from the northernmost tip to the Panamanian border as the crow flies.

Lying between 8 and 11 degrees north of the equator, Costa Rica sits wholly within the tropics, a fact quickly confirmed in the middle of a rainy afternoon in the middle of the rainy season in the middle of the sodden Caribbean lowlands or the Talamanca Mountains. Elevation and extremes of relief, however, temper the stereotypical tropical climate. In fact, the nation boasts more than a dozen distinct climatic zones. Atop the highest mountains in cooler months, even ice and snow aren't unknown.

A Backbone of Mountains

Costa Rica sits astride a jagged series of volcanoes and mountains, part of the great Andean-Sierra Madre chain, which runs the length of the western littoral of the Americas. From the Pacific coast of Costa Rica, great cones and domes dominate the landscape, and you're usually in sight of volcanoes in the northern part of the country.

The mountains rise in the nation's northwestern corner as a low, narrow band of hills. They grow steeper and broader and ever more rugged until they gird Costa Rica coast to coast at the Panamanian border, where they separate the Caribbean and Pacific from one another as surely as if these were the towering Himalayas.

Volcanic activity has fractured this mountainous backbone into distinct cordilleras. In the northwest, the **Cordillera de Guanacaste** rises in a leapfrogging series of volcanoes, including Rincón de la Vieja and Miravalles, whose steaming vents have been harnessed to provide geothermal energy. To the southeast is the **Cordillera de Tilarán**, dominated by Arenal, one of the world's most active volcanoes. To the east and rising even higher is the **Cordillera Central**, with four great volcanoes – Poás, Barva, Irazú and Turrialba – that gird the central highlands and within whose cusp lays the Meseta Central, an elevated plateau ranging in height from 900 to 1,787 meters. To the south of the valley rises the **Cordillera Talamanca**, an uplifted mountain region that tops out at the summit of Cerro Chirripó (3,819 meters), Costa Rica's highest peak.

Meseta Central

In Costa Rica, all roads radiate from the Meseta Central, the heart and heartbeat of the nation. This rich agricultural valley is cradled by the flanks of the Cordillera Talamanca to the south, and by the fickle volcanoes of the Cordillera Central to the north and east. San José, the capital, lies at its center. At an elevation of 1,150 meters, San José enjoys year-round temperatures above 21° C

(70° F), reliable rainfall, and rich volcanic soils – major reasons why almost two-thirds of the nation's population lives in the valley.

The Meseta Central – which measures about 40 km north to south and 80 km east to west – is divided into two separate valleys by the low-lying crests of the **Cerros de la Carpintera**, which rise a few miles east of San José. Beyond lays the somewhat smaller Cartago Valley, at a slightly higher elevation. The Carpinteras mark the Continental Divide. To the east the turbulent Reventazón – a favorite of white-water enthusiasts – tumbles helter-skelter to the Caribbean lowlands. The Río Virilla exits more leisurely, draining the San José Valley to the west.

Northern Lowlands and Caribbean Coast

The broad, pancake-flat, wedge-shaped northern lowlands are cut off from the more densely populated highlands by a languorous drape of virtually impenetrable hardwood forest that only the most accomplished outdoor types can penetrate without local guides. The low-lying plains or *llanuras*, which make up one-fifth of the nation's land area, extend along the entire length of the Río San Juan, whose course demarcates the Nicaraguan border. Farther south the plains narrow to a funnel along the Caribbean coast.

Westward, cattle ranches and banana and citrus plantations give way to pleats of green velveteen jungle ascending the steep eastern slopes of the central mountains, which run along a northwest-southeast axis, forming the third side of the wedge. Numerous rivers drop quickly from the mountains to the plains, where they snake along sluggishly. Beautiful beaches, many of gray or black sand, line the Caribbean coast, which sidles gently south.

Pacific Coast

Beaches are a major calling card of Costa Rica's Pacific coast, which is deeply indented with bays and inlets and two large gulfs – the Golfo de Nicoya (in the north) and Golfo Dulce (in the south), enfolded by the hilly, hook-nosed peninsulas of Nicoya and Osa, respectively. Mountains tilt precipitously toward the Pacific, coming closer to the ocean here than on the Caribbean side, and the slender coastal plain is only a few kilometers wide. North of the Golfo de Nicoya, the coastal strip widens to form a broad lowland belt of savanna – the Tempisque Basin. The basin is drained by the Río Tempisque, and narrows northward until hemmed in near the Nicaraguan border by the juncture of the Cordillera de Guanacaste and rolling, often steep, coastal hills that follow the arc of the Nicoya Peninsula.

Of growing importance to the national economy is the narrow, 64-km-long intermontane basin known as the Valle de El General, which runs parallel to and nestles comfortably between the Cordillera Talamanca and the coastal mountains – *Fila Costeña* – of the Pacific southwest. The Rios General and Coto Brus and their many tributaries have carved a deep, steep-sided trough, long isolated from the rest of the nation, although the construction of the Pan-American Highway through the valley in the 1950s brought thousands of migrant farmers and their families in its wake.

Ailanto is located right at the foothills of the Miravalles Volcano surrounded by the National Park, at Ailanto the visitors will live in the lap of luxury in a happier, healthier living and as such will cater to the tourist that seeks relaxation and pampering and we will have limited competition, but because of all our amenities, we will become the favorite destination in Costa Rica.

Eco-Tourism

Ecotourism, also known as **ecological tourism**, is a form of <u>tourism</u> which appeals to the ecologically and socially conscious. Generally speaking, ecotourism focuses on local culture, wilderness adventures, volunteering, personal growth, and learning new ways to live on the planet; typically involving travel to destinations where flora, fauna, and cultural heritage are the primary attractions.

Responsible ecotourism includes programs that minimize the negative aspects of conventional tourism on the environment, and enhance the cultural integrity of local people. Therefore, in addition to evaluating environmental and cultural factors, an integral part of ecotourism is in the promotion of recycling, energy efficiency, water conservation, and creation of economic opportunities for the local communities.

Many global environmental organizations and aid agencies believe that ecotourism has great potential for <u>sustainable development</u>.

Ideally, ecotourism should satisfy several criteria, such as:

- 1. conservation of biological diversity and cultural diversity, through ecosystem protection
- 2. promotion of sustainable use of biodiversity, by providing jobs to local populations
- Sharing of socio-economic benefits with local communities and <u>indigenous people</u> by having their <u>informed consent</u> and participation in the management of ecotourism enterprises
- 4. increase of environmental & cultural knowledge
- 5. minimization of tourism's own environmental impact
- 6. local culture, flora and fauna being the main attractions

For many countries, ecotourism is not simply a marginal activity to finance protection of the <u>environment</u> but as a major industry of the national <u>economy</u>.

For example, in <u>Costa Rica</u> ecotourism represents a significant portion of the <u>gross domestic</u> <u>product</u> and <u>economic activity</u>.

Although academics disagree about who can be classified as an ecotourist and there is precious little statistical data, some estimate that more than five million ecotourists - the majority of the ecotourist population - come from the <u>United States</u>, with others from Western Europe, Canada, and Australia.

Costa Rica as a well renowned Eco-tourism destination, millions of tourists come and will continue to come to enjoy this country's bounty.

This market study is based on facts aided by my experiences as a Medical and Real Estate developer and my education and credentials. I am a Baby Boomer, born in 1946 and experiencing the same needs and desires that my fellow Americans are experiencing in the uncertain US Economy and its rapid changes in Obama's Healthcare.

Most Americans have seen their savings and retirement programs demolished by the current recession, home values have plummeted, yet the cost of health and living continuing the upward spiral, many see no other option but to seek alternative places where to retire with their reduced income and savings.

One of the biggest mistakes that are being made by Marketeers is to assume that the WEALTHY AMERICAN is the one who is seeking to retire in Costa Rica, when the reality is that the Low to Middle Class American is who is looking at overseas retirement. On May 20, 2013, La Nacion published an Article about Costa Rica becoming a haven for Foreign Retirees and in the first paragraph the article stated the exact concept that Ailanto is focusing on, that is that People that need to conserve their limited resources will seek to retire in Foreign locations.

The nature of American retirement has changed over the past few decades because employees change jobs more frequently and employers have adjusted traditional pension programs. Instead of employer-funded retirement accounts, many Americans have self-funded accounts that travel

with them from job to job. Employers may contribute to individual retirement, but not at historical levels. The self-reliance on retirement funding has left some Americans neglecting their retirement accounts.

The amount of retirement savings that the "average" person has varies greatly between income levels and locations. Whether or not home equity is included is an essential element, because although many Americans consider themselves well-off if their homes are paid in full, they may have little in cash or retirement plan savings. The ultra-wealthy skew the data, too; nevertheless, there are some guidelines that draw a picture of America's retirees"Average" Versus Median

Understanding the difference between the mean and median figures is critical to gaining an understanding of what the "average" retire has in assets. Because the mean simply adds every net worth together and divides by the number of people, individuals with extraordinarily high net worths skew the data upward. The median is a better indicator of the "average" retiree's wealth, and it's easy to understand. The Federal Reserve Board makes a list from smallest to largest net worths and takes the middle number (or the average of the two middle numbers). Similar to a bell curve, the most similar data tends to be in the middle, and that's why the median is a better figure.

Home Equity: Having it Both Ways

Unfortunately, official household net worth and savings surveys are rare. The last US government survey was completed in 2007, prior to the recession.

In 2007, the Federal Reserve noted that the median net worth for a retired person was \$533,100. Since that figure includes home equity, it includes a large percentage of money that can't be easily converted to cash. The Congressional Research Service reported in 2007 that the median value of all accounts for those age 65 or older was \$60,800 (not including home equity).

In 2009, the Employee Benefit Research Institute updated that number to include that the average retirement savings was \$56,212 for those aged 65 to 75.

The Recession's Damage

In 2011, the Federal Reserve reported that the "average American family's household net worth declined 23 percent" between 2007 and 2009, according to an article on CNN's Money website. The Fed's report also noted that American families began plowing money into savings instead of spending – and putting money back into the economy. Contrary to popular report, the Fed also noted that "families in the top 10 percent of net worth" suffered an average decline of 13 percent, while "families below the national median income" saw earnings increase.

The Federal Reserve rarely performs household net worth surveys. However, given that retirees often have the most savings and home equity accumulated, it's fair to assume that their assets suffered as well, especially if the bulk of their net worths were concentrated in home equity.

The Average "Number"

The Federal Reserve's report noted that median income and age is not always a good predictor of future net worth. Although high-income earners typically have higher net worths, they may have more debt from expensive mortgages. They may also live in more expensive areas, resulting in less left over for savings. *Nevertheless, it's clear that American retirees expect to utilize their home as a retirement resource.*

The Average Retirement Expenses

Once a person retires, he will not maintain the same steady flow of income as he has while he worked. This means that more planning will have to go into preparing a budget and living within means.

Consistent Expenses

During retirement, some expenses will remain the same as before retirement began. Some of these expenses include car insurance, utilities, gas and food. Additionally, money spent on charitable contributions and gifts probably will remain the same.

Decreased Expenses


Upon retirement, expenses will decrease in several categories. You will no longer have to pay social security tax, and a retiree usually has a lower income tax. Work-related expenses and saving for retirement will no longer be needed either.

Increased Expenses

Some expenses will increase after retirement. Health care costs increase as a person grows older, especially if he/she retired before age 65. You will have to compensate for health care until you can receive medicare at age 65. Also, entertainment and leisure activities can take up a greater portion of a retiree's budget because of more leisure time.

Retirement Accounts

The dollar amount of American retirement accounts as of 2010 is split as follows: 27 percent of Americans have less than \$1,000 in their retirement account; 16 percent have \$1,000 to \$9,999; 23 percent have \$10,000 to \$49,999; 22 percent have \$50,000 to \$249,999; and 11 percent have \$250,000 or more.




Retirement Age Expectations

The 2008 recession changed retirement planning for many workers. According to the Employee Benefit Research Institute survey, 28 percent of workers said they changed their planned retirement age during the 2008 to 2009 recession, and 24 percent of workers were planning to delay their retirement in 2010. Poor economy was the No. 1 reason for the delay. Other reasons included, change in employment, deficient retirement funds, stock market losses and a higher cost of living.

Seventy percent of 2010 workers planned to have a working retirement, where they work at lease part-time during their retirement. Many of the working retired do so for the enjoyment of it, but 90 percent also have financial reasons, such as inadequate retirement accounts, making ends

meet or keeping health benefits. This provides us with an immense opportunity to market to those who wish to retire but can't because of financial reasons, we need to offer fair and inexpensive alternatives.

The Saving Grace




According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, 75 percent of adults age 45 to 54 owned their own homes in 2006 (compared to only 50 percent of 25 to 34 year olds. And while housing values may have decreased in recent years, home ownership still provides for a greater overall net worth.

The Ailanto concept focuses on these facts, most Americans that want to move to Costa Rica will shop for low prices/high benefits and as seen in the above charts they will rely on their Social Security income, the sale of their homes and the additional pensions that they may have, which combined will prove significant in Costa Rica but low for American Standards



For example, a destination such as Costa Rica is just a three hour direct flight from the US. ore importantly, as there is such a large American community already established people feel at home and have an infrastructure catering for Americans so there are lots of familiar shops and entertainment.

SS Benefits up 32% to Overseas Americans

No one knows how many American retirees now reside overseas. They aren't counted by the U.S. census, and many operate under the radar on renewable tourist visas. But according to the Social Security Administration, the number of retired Americans receiving benefits overseas has soared 32 percent since 2002, a figure experts say is gaining steam.

"The actual numbers are tough to quantify," says Demetrios Papademetriou, CEO of the nonprofit think tank Migration Policy Institute. "But it's a phenomenon that can only grow larger."

Demographics of the US Elder Care Market

According to the U.S. Census Bureau, the number of individuals in the US between the ages of 65 and 84 will increase by 38.8 percent between 2010 and 2020, while the population over age 85 will increase by 18.7 %. This aging of the population will create a large area of unmet demand


There are currently large discrepancies in the demographic makeup of retirement communities. As of 2006, retirement communities were 69% female and only 31% male.

The highest concentration Elder Living Facilities is in the Southeast portion of the U.S., which houses 23% of all facilities in the nation. The trend of retirees moving to the Sunbelt region of the U.S. is expected to spur further growth for this industry in this region.

One can extrapolate that the Elder US population will consider Costa Rica as an extension of the Sunbelt, just CHEAPER

Conclusion

The sheer number of Baby Boomers is staggering but we need to immediately rule out from our target market those 35% of Americans who have the capacity to retire and live with Comfort in the United States and those 43% who do not have the means to move and retire in Costa Rica, leaving us with 22% of the 78 Million as potential Costa Rican Retirees, a very significant number considering that we are looking for 50 residents. To put it in perspective, we are looking for 0.0027% and that is only of US retirees, not even counting the many Costa Rican, European and Asiatics that may also see Costa Rica as their Retirement Paradise.



In conclusion the project will be successful providing that the basic concepts are adhered to and that the home and monthly fees remain within the reach of the 22% target market.

The Marketing Plan

The Marketing plan has many steps and resources available. It is wise to utilize outside, performance based resources and to train the salaried staff to take care of the clients and residents as they represent the success or failure of the company.
